

The M&M Game

Grade: 9-12th

Objective: Provides students with skills practice for communicating boundaries and

preferences in a safe way.

Materials: M&M's (Colors: Red, Orange, Green, Blue, Yellow, Brown)

Procedure:

1. One a piece of paper, have each student write down:

One color of M&M's they hate and will not eat

Two colors they must have together. (IE. If I have red, I must have yellow.)

One color that is their favorite

- 2. Have students crumple up paper and lightly toss them around the room. Have each student grab the closest paper so they all end up with someone else's paper.
- 3. Group students in pairs. Explain that they need to decide on a color choice that they can each have that is the same color. They must come up with at least one color but they can choose more than one.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. How did that go?
- 2. How did you start the conversation?
- 3. Could you have guessed ahead of time what the other person's preferences were?
- 4. Did anyone have a partner who had the same favorite color?
- 5. What are some other examples of decision making and respecting your partners boundaries?
- 6. What would it be like to have a similar conversation about sexual limitations with someone?
