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



Equity: Uncovering and dismantling systems of power and privilege.

Inclusion: Experiences, true and

Shared Language

Anti - Racist: The work of actively opposing racism by advocating for changes in political, economic and social life. What "not racist" looks like in action.

Decolonization: The process of deconstructing colonial ideologies/privilege of Western thought.

Marginalization: Social exclusion, treatment of a person or group as peripheral. Often includes denial of rights, resources or social supports.



OppressionSystemic subjugation of one social group by a more powerful group for social, economic or political benefit.

White Supremacy: A racist ideology based on the belief that white people are superior to people of other races and should be dominant. White supremacy is not just an individual attitude, but extends to how systems and institutions operate.

White Supremacy Culture at Work

- 1. The right to not have children;
- 2. The right to have the children we want to have;
 - a. The right to control the conditions under which we have children
- 3. The right to raise children in safe and healthy environments
- 4. The right to maintain personal bodily autonomy.




Guiding Principles
